OVERVIEW OF VIDEO MODELLING:




Video modelling is a mode of teaching that uses video recording and display equipment to provide a visual model of the targeted behaviour or skill.

- EBP: Video modelling meets evidence-based practice (EBP) criteria
- Age-group: The evidence-based research suggests that video modelling can be effectively implemented with learners from early childhood through to secondary school.
- DOMAINS: In the evidence-based studies, the domains of communication, social skills, cognition, and play were represented.
- □ Settings: In the studies, video modelling was successfully implemented in both home and school settings.

COURSE FORMAT:

This course will be delivered online over a period of 4 - 5 weeks and will include:

- Three 45-minute on-demand sessions
- Access to research and instructional videos on video modellina
- Expert personalised coaching in applying video modelling in your own classroom setting
